How to Check if Your PC Has TPM for Windows 11

Trusted Platform Module (TPM) is a security device hardwired into your computer's CPU. For operating systems like Windows 10, you need to use features like BitLocker, encryption, and decryption of the hard drive. In fact, when Windows 8 first came out, you needed TPM version 1.2 for BitLocker. However, there was a **workaround for Windows 8.1**. But I digress...A requirement for running Windows 11 (at least from what we know now) is that your PC needs TPM 2.0. Here is a way to see if your PC has TPM and the version.

Check Using TPM Management Tool

First, use the **keyboard shortcut Windows Key** + **R** to bring up the Run dialog. Then **type**: *tpm.msc* and hit Enter or click **OK**.

Next, The Trusted Platform Module (TPM) utility will launch. Here you want to look for **Status** and **TPM Manufacturer Information**. In my example below, the status is: "The TPM is ready to use." And the Manufacturer info is version 2.0. That means my CPU is good to go for running Windows 11.

How to Find Memory Leak in Windows 10 and Fix it

At times, certain applications on Windows 10 start using more than the usual system RAM. This causes the abnormality in the device, and it becomes sluggish and started to hang. Under such conditions, computer users are unable to open even basic applications. This irregularity generally happens because of the Memory Leak in Windows 10.

In this post, we would discuss what a memory leak is and how to fix it.

Find Out How Much vRAM Do You Have and Need?

What is Memory Leak in Windows 10?

In Windows 10, a memory leak is caused when an application consumes so much RAM that other applications cannot run because of no RAM availability.

Every application on Windows 10 requires a certain amount of RAM to launch and run properly. Generally, applications take a few amounts of RAM so that multiple apps can run simultaneously; some other applications like Chrome or Photoshop are demanding and consume more RAM than other typical applications.


When an application consumes more than the required amount of RAM, it is termed a memory leak.

How to Fix Computer Low on Memory in Windows 10

How do I find Memory Leak in Windows 10?

If your computer is misbehaving and becoming sluggish, then there is a total possibility that it might be because of a memory leak. To find a memory leak in Windows 10, follow these steps:

1. Right-click on the Windows taskbar, and choose Task Manager.

2. Click on the Memory tab to arrange applications in ascending order of the memory use.



- 3. Analyze which applications are using a large amount of system RAM, thus causing the Memory Leak.
- 4. You can select those applications one by one and click on End Task to close them.


Use Windows Memory Diagnostic Tool

Windows 10 comes with an in-built tool to diagnose memory problems. Here are the steps to use Windows Memory Diagnostic Tool.

1. Click on the Start button, and on the windows search box, type Windows Memory Diagnostic.



2 Click on Restart now and check for problems.



How to Enter Text with Your Voice on a Chromebook

Typing out a message with your voice on an Android phone or iPhone is incredibly easy to do. You can do the same thing on a Chromebook, too, and it is easier than you might think. We will show you how it works.

There are two methods for entering text with your voice on a Chrome OS device. Both utilize the onscreen keyboard, but if you're using a physical keyboard, there are some extra steps to get to it.

On a Chromebook with a Physical Keyboard

We will start with the physical keyboard method. This applies to using a Chromebook as a laptop or with an external keyboard connected. Basically, any setup that prevents the onscreen keyboard from popping up.

First, click the clock to open the Quick Settings menu, and then select the gear icon to go to the Settings menu.



In the Settings, click "Advanced" to expand the sidebar menu, and then select "Accessibility."



You will immediately see a microphone icon appear next to the clock on the Shelf. Click the icon to start speaking on a message.




A message will tell you that voice input data is sent to Google the first time that you use the voice-typing feature. Click "Got It" to proceed.

On a Touch Screen-Only Chromebook

The second method is for when you're using a Chrome OS device in tablet mode. This happens if your Chromebook simply doesn't have a keyboard or the keyboard is folded back or detached.


All you have to do is tap in a text box to bring up the virtual onscreen keyboard.

You can now start talking, and your words will appear in the text box. Tap anywhere on the screen to stop the listening.



That's it! It should be noted that the first method works with touch screen-only devices as well. This is a nice feature to have when you do not want to physically type something out.

How to Freely Move Pictures in Microsoft Word




By default, you can't freely move pictures (by drag-and-drop) to any position in a Microsoft Word document without also placing them somewhere in the text. But with a small change, you can drag images anywhere.

Here's how.

Make a Picture Freely Move in a Word Document


Using the method below, you can move a picture anywhere you want in your Word document—outside of the normal flow of text. You can even place the picture on top of an existing block of text if you want. We'll use a blank document to do this. Start by opening Microsoft Word on your Windows or Mac computer. On Word's first screen, select "Blank Document" to create a new document.






In Word's editing window that opens, click the "Insert" tab at the top.



In the "Insert" tab under the "Illustrations" section, click Pictures > This Device. This lets you add a picture from your computer.




Use the "File Explorer" window that opens to navigate to the folder containing your picture. Double-click the picture to add it to your Word document.

Back on Word's editing screen, right-click the image that you just added and select Wrap Text > In Front of Text from the menu.





Make All Future Pictures Freely Move in a Word Document

If you'd like to make all of your future pictures freely move in your Word documents, you can modify an option in Word's settings menu. To do so, first, open Microsoft Word on your Windows or Mac computer. On Word's main screen in the lower-left corner, click "Options."

Note: If you're on Word's document editing screen instead, click "File" at the top to see the "Options" option.



Click "OK" at the bottom of the "Word Options" window to close the window.



And that's it. From now on, Word will allow you to freely move pictures on top of text in your documents.

Why You Should Update Your Web Browser



Have you updated your web browser recently? Most browsers update themselves, but be sure to check that your browser is handling it! Regular updates are vital for everything, from making sure you can see the modern web to protecting your devices and privacy.

Browser Updates Protect You

You should be aware that running an out-of-date web browser could put your system at risk. Bad actors will use vulnerabilities in web browsers to target users with malware such as ransomware, privacy exploits, and other attacks.

So-called "drive-by downloads" will attempt to download malicious content onto your computer regardless of whether you consent to it. All you need to do is visit a compromised website or be served a malicious advert, and you don't even need to be visiting unsavory corners of the web, since many of these attacks are spread via social media.

Then there's the practice known as "malvertising," which inserts malicious code into legitimate-looking adverts. According to a report by Confiant, 1 in 200 online advertisements is malicious. Depending on

where you live in the world, you might see many more malicious adverts. Patching your browser can help defend against such vulnerabilities, particularly once they become common knowledge.

Extensions and plugins that you have installed alongside a browser could also pose a risk. Adobe finally put Flash to rest in January of 2021, with security vulnerabilities playing a large part in that decision. All versions of Flash since May of 2020 have had a killswitch in them that disabled the plugin permanently after December 31, 2020.

If you're running a version of Flash released prior to this (32.0.0.371 or earlier) on a browser that hasn't been updated since then, you're assuming a huge level of risk every time you browse the web. If you're holding out because you're fond of Flash, you should know that there are **ways of using Flash** that don't put you at risk.

Browser updates can disable extensions and plugins with known vulnerabilities or change the underlying code in a way that renders these exploits ineffective.

Privacy exploits in browsers are also common. In May of 2021, FingerprintJS discovered a vulnerability in Safari, Chrome, Firefox, and Tor Browser that could link a user's identity across different desktop browsers, effectively bypassing privacy protections put in place by those same browsers. By the time FingerprintJS had discovered the issue, Chrome's developers had already added a fix to their update roadmap. Of course, you won't get the benefit if you don't apply the update.

Browser-based attacks can also do some pretty eyebrow-raising things when taken to extremes. There are many examples of devices being jailbroken that use browser exploits, such as the iPhone OS 3 jailbreak that exploited a flaw in the way that Safari rendered PDF files. This provided hackers with the system-level access that they needed to install custom firmware on Apple's smartphone.


Even if you're not attempting to jailbreak, from a security standpoint, Safari is probably your iPhone's weakest link.

How to Update Your Web Browser

Most browsers update automatically in the background, but you can always force an update by manually checking. In some cases, browser updates are tied to operating system upgrades, with a few caveats for security updates.

How to Update Microsoft Edge

If you use Microsoft Edge, you can <u>manually check for an Edge update</u> by first launching the browser and then using the "Help" drop-down menu at the top of the window (on Windows) or screen (on a Mac), and then clicking the "Update Microsoft Edge" button.



You can also get there using the ellipsis "..." icon, followed by Settings > About Microsoft Edge.
